SHB 1016	Designates Juneteenth as a state legal holiday. Passed and headed to the Governor for signature	With the end of session in sight, disagreements between the House and Senate begin to resolve. However, a bill can die even at this point. The largest effort over the remaining days is to achieve consensus on the capital, operating and transportation budgets.
2SHB 1044	Creating prison to postsecondary education pathways: Permits degree programs at correctional facilities. House concurred with Senate amendments	
ESHB 1054	Peace Officer Tactics & Equipment: Prohibits certain tactics used by peace officers such as the use of chokeholds, tear gas, etc. Amended in the Senate. House refuses to agree. Conference committee assigned.	
ESHB 1078	Voter Eligibility / Felony. The bill restores voting rights to anyone convicted of a felony but outside of total DOC confinement. Passed. Governor's signed	
E2SHB 1086	Creating the State office of Behavioral Health Consumer Advocacy. The new state office to coordinate behavioral health activities statewide. Amended by the Senate. House agrees.	Consider communicating with your representatives during the interim to discuss matters important to you. Legislation begins with you. SHB 1088	Concerning Potential Impeachment Disclosures. Requires disclosure of potential impeachment disclosure of a peace officer before hire. Passed both chambers. Amended in the Senate. House agrees.	
E2SHB 1089	Concerning Compliance Audits of Requirements Relating to Peace Officers and Law enforcement Agencies. The bill authorizes the state auditor, at the request of a commission, to review a law enforcement agency. Amended by the Senate. House agrees.	
EBH 1090	Concerning Private, For-profit Detention Facilities - prohibits private, for-profit detention facilities with certain exceptions. Governor signed	
ESHB 1108	Foreclosure Assistance - maintains funding and assistance for homeowners in foreclosure. Amended in Senate. House agrees.	
ESHB 1113	School Attendance: Makes culturally responsive changes to support student success. In Rules. Delivered to Governor for signature	
EBH 1121	Graduation Requirement / Emergency - authorizes school districts to grant individual student emergency waiver criteria towards graduation requirements. Governor signed	
2SHB 1127	COVID-19 Health Data Privacy - establishes safeguards of an individual's COVID-19 health information. Amended in Senate. House agrees	
ESHB 1140	Juvenile Access to Attorneys - Provides an attorney to a juvenile before constitutional rights are waived. Amended in Senate. House agrees.	
E2SHB 1152	Supporting Measures to Create Public Health Districts. Amended in Senate. House agrees.	
SHB 1171	Amending Child Support Withholding Provisions requires an income withholding order for child support orders. Governor signed	
ESHB 1176	Concerning Access to Higher Education. prohibits the withholding of student transcripts. Amended in Senate. House agrees.	
E2SHB 1186	Concerning Juvenile Rehabilitation creates community-based supports for youth reentry into the community. Amended in Senate. House agrees	
E2SHB 1227	Protecting the rights of families responding to allegations of abuse or neglect of a child requires the placement of a child with a parent and the release of a child to a parent by a court when evidenced as safe. House agrees to Senate amendments	
ESHB 1443	Social Equity / Cannabis expands the task force regarding existing cannabis licenses. House agrees to Senate amendments	
E2SSB 5051	Concerning state oversight and accountability of peace officers and corrections officers. Modifies the Criminal Justice Training Commission and requires background checks for potential peace officers. Passed House and Senate	
E2SSB 5052	Health Equity Zones addresses health disparities in communities of color. Passed House and Senate	
SSB 5066	Concerning a peace officer's duty to intervene - requires a peace officer to intervene when a fellow officer engages in excessive force. Passed House and Senate	
SSB 5068	Improving Maternal Health Outcomes - extends coverage during the Postpartum Period authorizing one year of post-partum care through Apple Health. Delivered to Governor	
ESSB 5097	Paid Leave Coverage - expands the paid family and medical leave program. Passed House and Senate	
ESSB 5118	Provides for actions to support offenders with re-entry. Passed House and Senate	
ESSB 5119	Requires DOC convene a review team in the event of an unexpected inmate death. Headed to Governor's desk	
ESSB 5122	Concerning the Jurisdiction of a Juvenile Court changes the maximum age in juvenile court to 19 and the maximum age of presumed inability to commit a crime to age 13. Passed Senate. Died in House Rules	
ESB 5135	Allows civil penalty for false summoning of a police officer. Headed to Governor's desk	



- E2SSB 5141** Implements the recommendations of the Environmental Justice Task Force. Passed both chambers
- SSB 5151** Concerning Foster Care and Child Care Licensing makes a certain DCYF pilot program permanent and other changes. Passed both chambers
- E2SSB 5160** Establishes eviction protections for tenants. Passed House and Senate
- 2SSB 5183** Non-fatal Strangulation develops best practices to medically support victims of domestic violence strangulation. In Senate Rules committee. Passed both House and Senate
- E2SSB 5188** Creates the Washington State Public Bank to provide financial opportunities to residents. Died in House Rules committee
- E2SSB 5194** Providing Equity and Access in the Community and Technical Colleges requires development of a diversity and inclusion strategic plan. Passed both House and Senate
- E2SSB 5227** Requires Diversity, Equity, Inclusion and Anti-racism Training and Assessments in Higher Education establishes a diversity, equity, inclusion and anti-racism training for faculty and staff. Passed both chambers
- SSB 5228** Addressing Disproportionate Health Outcomes Through Equity in Medical Training requires the development of a health equity curriculum for medical students. Sent to Governor
- ESSB 5229** Concerning Health Equity Continuing Training for Health Professionals requires health equity education every four years for licensees. Amended in House. Senate agrees
- SB 5431** Creating the Rosa Franklin Legislative Internship Program scholarship. Sent to Governor
